

Children Are People-Kenya Pastor John & Tabitha Garang



In February, Pastor John and Tabitha Garang welcomed a new addition to their family, a baby boy they named Israel. In April, Children Are People helped provide an Easter celebration, which included cookies and soda (quite a special treat for the children!). April 2012 brought challenges for John, Tabby and the staff that help care for

the 117 children living in Kenya as they faced a chickenpox outbreak. Attending to their medical needs was more than a full-time job for all of the care takers. The children returned to school in May 2012 after their typical break from classes in the month of April.

In August 2012, Pastor John made his first trip to the United States, staying through November. John initially came to receive medical

treatment for an ongoing infection in his leg after stepping on a land mine (aka RPG) when he was a child soldier. After being seen by a physician in Mississippi, we learned severe dental disease was causing his illness and creating a secondary infection in his leg. Thanks to the generosity of the dentist he visited, John underwent extensive and costly



dental treatment that ultimately saved his life.

Receiving the medical care needed was just the beginning of the blessings that occurred while John was in the United States. Through his visit, Children Are People, Inc. became acquainted with the Guest family of Oxford, Mississippi who support Mama

Doris Stotlar. Mama Doris founded Bungoma Bible School in Kenya where John graduated and lived. The Guest family of Oxford, Mississippi purchased the land where Pastors John and Tabitha's church now stands. Children Are People, Inc. The team arrived in Nairobi where they were welcomed with loving arms by John and Tabitha Garang. They rested for the evening in the Methodist Missionary Hotel in Nairobi. The first day the team traveled for eight hours by bus to Moi's Bridge, arriving to be welcomed by a number of people from Word of Life church who serve with Children Are People– Kenya.

During the day we were able to walk in the steps of Pastor John, helping him in serving all of those in the ministry of Children Are People. In the evenings the team enjoyed time singing and praying with the children in the evenings at John's house. Some of the things we enjoyed were playing soccer with children, fellowship in the Word with the young men and women, and conversations as we broke bread. Regardless of the African

storms or sunshine, overall the time resting in Him with Children Are People proved to be refreshing and a real joy during our team's journey. While there, the Mosley's were so touched by the work being done, plans to relocate to Kenya have been made by the family. Michael, his wife who is a nurse, and two children will soon be moving to Kenya to help support John and Tabitha in the ministry and care for the Sudanese children.




